hallenges are part of everyone's life and sometimes we have to face them individually and sometimes collectively. In these last two years, with the support of many people and institutions, we have reinforced our commitment to carry out work that makes a difference and impacts the lives of the residents of our community.

In this purpose, we continue to provide various services from our library, such as: the use of Wi-Fi, computers with internet, study tables, in a comfortable environment that makes it easier for both students and professionals to fulfill their educational and work objectives. In particular, we are able to make loans of books from our extensive literary collection, with a view toward satisfying and increasing our reading population, especially among children and youth.

For this reason, in 2018, the ""Bebeteca was born, a project supported by the "Sus Buenos Vecinos Foundation" of the "Banco General", which provides an ideal space where children can be encouraged to develop the habit and enjoyment of reading, from their first months of life, under the guidance of their parents or relatives.

We are grateful to have obtained the support of various institutions and people, such as the Rockefeller Philanthropic Foundation, the Patricia Price Peterson Foundation, and others, who coincided in our goals. With their support we managed to develop in various areas such as education, music, art and advance in international relations.

In education, our flagship program "An Adventure with the Book and Me" was divided into two approaches, with two sponsors. In charge of the Fundación Sus Buenos Vecinos del Banco General, "An adventure with the book and Me", a Spanish version, took place in 2018. And, under the umbrella of the United States Embassy, "An adventure with the Book and Me, Bilingual", in the years 2018 and 2019, respectively.

With the focus on reading, both approaches predicted that the students of the selected schools, mostly from rural and remote areas of the Boquete district, could improve their cognitive, motor and emotional skills, through the use of a methodology that is innovative, playful and effective. We therefore anticipated the positive outcome that was later demonstrated.

In tune with the music, we offer a monthly concert billboard, of national and international stature, worthy of praise. Various artists and musicians shared their talents with virtuoso performances that often exceeded our expectations. To this we add our permanent gallery of painters, photographers, artisans, who month after month adorned the walls of our institution with various artistic manifestations. Likewise, in support of cinema, monthly film screenings have been taking place.

In a special way we highlight the realization of the Book Fair in Boquete, in its third edition, a unique project in our community, which brings together a distinguished number of national and international authors, publishers, bookstores, artists, organizations and public and private institutions that give prestige to our district. There were many activities that were carried out, taking into account all ages, and without a doubt, this has become a literary event of great importance for the educational sector, with positive repercussions in various social spheres.

During this administration, we were pleasantly surprised by the contact by ambassadors from different countries: England, the United States, Peru, Spain and China, who chose our institution to promote various initiatives or events.

We are very pleased to contribute our grain of sand to improve the educational and cultural level of our fellow citizens. It has been an honor and a challenge to be able to reinvent ourselves and tune into the educational and cultural needs that our region requires. On the following pages, we share a summary of these intense activities.

To all who supported us, we thank you for the trust and faith you have placed in us. We are sure that the sum of all efforts will have a great impact on the lives of many people.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

At the end of each year, we are satisfied with the great acceptance of the participating students in the following reading programs. Through the caregivers, we receive the testimony about the excitement of their children when coming to the library.

KNOWING MY LIBRARY

This program is aimed at kindergarten and first grade children (ages 5 and 6). It promotes the awareness of children about the library. Children acquire a broader vision of the services offered by this type of institution, how it works, what activities can be carried out and the option of having their own card in order to carry books of their choice to their homes. The visit includes the narration of a story and the participation in activities that allow them to identify with the habit of reading.

For the execution of this program, we have the support of the "Sus Buenos Vecinos Foundation" of the "Banco General", which covers the transportation and snack costs of the participants, in addition to the fees of the teacher in charge. For the 2018 school period, 349 children from five local schools were able to participate in this initiative.

AN ADVENTURE WITH THE BOOK AND ME (IN SPANISH)

Thanks also to the sponsorship of the "Sus Buenos Vecinos Foundation" of the "Banco General", this program is aimed at children from first to third grade (6, 7 and 8 years old) and its main objective is to offer students of public schools in the Boquete district, a support and motivational tool to raise awareness towards reading and writing in Spanish.

With themes that reinforce concepts of interest, each of the ten visits has a musical activity, storytelling, analytical questions and manual activities that exercise motor skills. Each session ends with a closing activity and the eating of a snack. 64 children from various local schools participated in this program during the 2018 period.

AN ADVENTURE WITH THE BOOK AND ME (BILINGUAL)

This bilingual program (in English and Spanish) envisioned the possibility of stimulating reading and basic acquisition of the English language in students whose schools had major limitations. The United States Embassy in Panama believed in its feasibility and joined the task of supporting us to work with 113 children belonging to rural schools in the Alto Quiel, Jaramillo Abajo, Palmira Abajo and Palo Alto areas, for the year 2018.

During 2019, we continued with the program, with a total of 73 children, many of whom have participated for two consecutive years, managing to reinforce many of the concepts learned. During several sessions, the children's progress followed various strategies that guided the reading and writing process through art, music, games and storytelling. To bring it to reality, the sponsorship included: transportation of children between the school and the library, books, fees of the teachers in charge, materials, and snacks, among others.



For these two programs, children are evaluated, at the beginning and at the end of the period, in the following areas: emotional development (interaction with other students, participation of the child in activities and apparent confidence), motor skills (skill with scissors, with the pencil, ability to jump, move, ability to handle small objects), literacy development (interest in books, reading and writing, association of figures with stories, answering questions related to reading, self-presentation, writing and recognizing their printed name), cognitive development (easily identify colors, geometric figures, identify numbers, knowing how to count).

MY TRAVELERS BOOKS

In Boquete we have a population of more than 800 children who attend local public schools, between kindergarten and third grade. Most do not have transportation, much less have libraries in their schools. It is a great challenge for us to get all the children from these schools to come to the library with this program. At our headquarters, we come to serve a certain number of infants, and due to the aforementioned circumstances, we must bring the books to their schools and allow them to be used for two weeks



SERVICES AND USES OF THE FACILITIES

Many students from schools, colleges and / or universities come together for individual or group work, book consultations, newspaper reading. Some use public computers, others use Wi-Fi; Books are loaned to them, either for use in or outside the library. The multipurpose conference room is regularly used for seminars, workshops, film presentations, meetings, organizational trainings, artistic presentations, among others. The library is also a reference point for meetings of partners, friends, professionals and for the public. In addition, many schools in different parts of the province organize group tours to get to know the library, taking advantage of the large number of books and resources available, making this a time and place of great importance for many children.



III BOOK FAIR 2019

UNDER THE SLOGAN "READING, KEY TO EDUCATION AND A BETTER LIFE"

One of the most ambitious initiatives the library administration has undertaken is to hold an international book fair every two years at its facilities. It represents a major challenge in raising funds to defray expenses and involves very detailed and comprehensive planning and organization.

The fair was held on this occasion in April, for four days, with the aim of ensuring that students from schools, colleges, universities and the general public attended and enjoyed all the planned activities, in a synchronized manner, in the three library floors.









During the fair important dates are highlighted; On this occasion, the main lobby contained a replica tower of Old Panama to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the founding of Panama City, a fact celebrated throughout the country, and we included in the fair repertoire, many activities alluding to the theme. More than 2,400 people participated in the four days in which this fair event took place.



Taking into consideration that we have limited resources and space to accommodate the entire student population of rural schools in our district and we are also aware of the limited resources of those schools, we took the initiative this year to schedule visits by some writers to the schools so that children could meet them. In that way, the authors could share recreational and reading activities with the children, thus managing to extend even more, the Book Fair event into the educational community.


