They managed to remain as a group throughout the year, and every Saturday gathered to share works like the Little Prince, Uncle Tom's Cabin, Charlotte's Web, The Courage of Sarah Noble, Rubilito, Abelita and many more books.

The extension programs carried out in some schools as Alto Quiel, Palmira Abajo, La Estrella Los Valles, Down Jaramillo and Palmira Centro, was able to serve more than 300 children. For several weeks of the school year we took them a lot of books to enrich their knowledge, we share with them their readings, we enjoy their love, enthusiasm, and sometimes sadness. The reality for many of these children are broken homes, little food, and poor school performance.

This event managed to become a historic moment for Boquete, extolling our region and the entire community.

More than 300 children have received the benefits of this program. We provide books to students, changing them every week, further supporting them with reading comprehension. Also, each group is brought to the library to know the facility.

We counted with the presence of professional storytellers, artists and authors of children's books; offering the best to all the audience, especially kids, all enjoying the readings, the presentation of children's books, puppets and oral narratives. Schools and institutions, contributed with artistic presentations during the event.

More than fifteen of the best publishers and bookstores were present, offering visitors books in different genres. A total of approximately 3,000 people visited our library, which became the biggest news in our province in those days, because of the importance given to the books and writers.







