PROMOTING LITERACY



STORY TIME

Last August the library began hosting a weekly bilingual story time for community preschoolers. Volunteer librarian Bonnie Adams shares her love of books with children and their teachers. This program also attracts parents throughout the community. Children have been introduced to a variety of popular children's books and characters. After the story, children participate in fun activities that further promote literacy.

Guided Tours

Students from schools throughout the area visited the library with the goal of learning about the various opportunities the library has to offer and see what a valuable asset a library is to a community.

During the visits, children listened to a brief explanation about library services and then had the opportunity to enjoy a book of their choosing in a variety of reading areas.

Some schools also had the opportunity to participate in presentations by authors who shared the history of their books





Education and Presentations

Over the past year, U.S. Embassy, Panama staffers came to the library from Panama City in order to make the following presentations.

- Arbor Day Children from several local schools attended a lecture on the importance of trees to our environment before planting numerous plants and trees in the newly established gardens surrounding the building. Each child was then asked to create and submit a drawing depicting what they learned. These drawings were scored by "ReAL Boquete" and hung in the library for everyone to admire. The best of the best were then awarded prizes and recognized in the local press.
- 2. Mathematics in Baseball Members of local youth baseball teams, age 10 to 15, were introduced to the use of mathematics in baseball. Using Major League Baseball players from Panama as examples, students were motivated to utilize their math skills and learn new ones as they calculated various statistics that abound in the sport.

3. The Roll of Civil Society – A lecture was presented to local high school students that highlighted the benefits of volunteering for both the volunteer and the local community.

MATHEMATICS

WEEKLY MATH PROGRAMS

Throughout the year, local volunteers, including Ellen Bolton, Mel Adams, and Ross Blankert, kept the math ball rolling by providing continuing education on subjects ranging from algebra to trigonometry to dozens of local school children.





ENGLISH



ENGLISH LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION

English classes were held at the library for ten months, primarily catering to the adult community. The classes are a valuable addition, opening the door to better job opportunities and supplementing previous studies. These classes were offered in colaboration with volunteers Robert Lawrence and Michael Balance.



Poetry



Commemorating the month of November, Antonio Singh, from Casa Cultural la Guaricha, introduced locals to the beauty of poetry. During the day, students and teachers from local schools and some "friends of the library" participated in the reading of more than 40 poems.

Other Activities

- "Learning and Playing Chess" for children and adults
- The library has served to connect young students from Guadalupano who are involved in the project called "Young Scientists" sponsored by "SENACYT".
- Scholarly expositions La Escuela Josefa Montero de Vasquez organized an exhibition featuring the use of recycled materials to create artwork as it is being done by the local indigenous Indians.







Special Collections

In 2013, the library received diverse donations of collectable materials from local scholars.

Stanley Heckadon Moreno, who was born in Chiriqui, trained to be an anthropologist, and spent much of his adult life working for the Smithsonian Institute, honored the Boquete Library by donating his personal collection, which includes more than 2500 items, ranging from books that influenced his life, to scientific papers and journals detailing his studies of the history, ecology, and culture of Central and South America.

This unique collection has been housed, thanks to a donation by the **Fundación Buenos Vecinos del Banco General** in a specially designed area on the second floor, which allows access to designated individuals.



The library received an extraordinary donation of a nearly complete bound collection of National Geographic dating back to the early 1900s. This magazine is famous throughout the world for its excellent photography and reporting of cultural and scientific phenomenon. To have a collection such as this is equivalent to having the important stories from around the world spanning the 20th century. It is likely a one-of-a-kind collection here in Panama. Thank you **Dean and Lesa Hoover** for your donation.

Advancing the Arts

Educational Program for Children

In 2013, El Centro de Estudios Superiores Escuela de Bellas Artes del INAC, lead by Lic. Leslie Samudio and her team, taught a variety of cultural art classes for local youth. More than 120 children attended the classes, which included ballet, music, drawing, painting, pottery and folkloric dance.



Another large contributor to the arts was **Sra. María Elena Watts** who taught painting classes to over 30 children over a 4 month period. These classes were supported by Bouqete Art Works with the donation of supplies for the children.









Course on Christmas Crafts for ladies

Taught by members of Dirección Regional del INAC, fourteen local women participated in a six week course where they learned how to make a variety of Christmas crafts.



Art Exhibitions:

The library hosted a variety of art exhibitions in the 3rd floor gallery. These exhibitions provide the opportunity for local artists to promote their work. In addition, visitors have the opportunity to view the rotating exhibits and purchase work.

José Cáceres, performed a Christmas concert in December to an audience of more than 60 people.






BOOK SALES



Registered Users






